

### **A Few Considerations**


- Do not confuse cost with worth





### **SUNY Application Process**

- Complete the Application for Admission
- Pay the application fee = \$50 per campus choice
- Complete Supplemental Applications
- Submit your academic record
- Send supporting documentation to campuses
- Check with individual campuses for specifics (deadlines, and special entry options)
- Receive a decision from each campus



### **SUNY Application Tips**

- Do your discovery first
- Applications are available August 1
- Submit the application that works best for you
- Use application worksheets
- Start your essay early
- Apply by December 1






